How to Resolve Medicare Liens post-October 1, 2010

As of October 1, 2010, all settlements, judgments, awards or other payments of more than \$5,000 involving Medicare beneficiaries must be reported to Medicare under Section 111 mandatory reporting. (*Actual reporting will take place in the 1st quarter of 2011*). This applies to any workers' compensation, liability, or no-fault claim in which an illness/injury is claimed and/or released by the settlement, judgment or award. The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) is not implementing Section 111 for the sole purpose of reporting. The primary purpose is to ensure all parties abide by the Medicare Secondary Payer Act in resolving the claim, but most important to Medicare is resolving its injury-related conditional payments, otherwise known as the Medicare Lien.
